

Curvy Pouch

- * Please read the entire pattern before you start knitting.
- * The pouch is knit from the top down.
- * You can also knit this in any yarn weight just make sure you use needles that will give you a tight fabric

Reading the pattern

Stitches between asterisks *...* are to be repeated

Pattern

Cast on 72 stitches. Join in the round without twisting.

Round1 : Knit all around

Round 2: Purl all around

Round 3 – 23 : Knit all around.

Round 24: K12, PM, K12, PM, K24, PM, K12, PM, K12

Round 25: *K10, SKPSSO, SM, K12, SM, K2Tog, K 10*

Round 26 - 34: Knit to last two stitches before marker, SKPSSO, SM, K12, SM, K2Tog, Knit to last two stitches before marker, SKPSSO, SM, K12, SM, K2Tog, Knit to end of the round.

Arrange your stitches on two needles, each needle should have 14 stitches.

Use the kitchener stitch to close the bottom.

Size modification

If you would like to make a larger or smaller case, cast on a multiple of 6.

Number of stitches = 6 x n

Work rounds 1 and 2 as above.

Knit for n x 2 rounds.

A very simple little pouch that can be made using leftover skeins and can be made as large or as small as you need. It is knit in the round from the top down and is completely seamless. The given size of the finished pouch, needle sizes and yarn used is for the blue sample. You can use any size needles with any weight of yarn if you follow the formula at the end of the pattern.

Skill Level: Intermediate

Needle Size: US size 4 (3.5 mm) DPNs or two circulars whichever you prefer

Yarn Weight: DK weight

Yardage: 60 yards (55 meters)

Finished Size

6.5 inches wide and 4 inches high when laid flat.

Other materials needed

Tapestry needle

5 stitch markers

Zipper

Abbreviations

K: Knit

P: Purl

PM: Place Marker

SM: Slip Marker

RM: Remove Marker

K2Tog :Knit two stitches together

SKPSSO: Slip one stitch, knit one stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch.
